(b) for the trial of a person of the rank of commander in the said Navy if the president and two other members of the court are of the rank of substantive or acting commander.

PAKISTAN (CONTROL OF ENTRY) ORDINANCE, 1948

No. 17/2/49 PMT, 18th November 1949.—In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (b) of subsection (2) of section 7 of the Pakistan (Control of Entry) Ordinance, 1948 (XVII of 1948) the Central Government is pleased to direct that the following further amendments shall be made in the Permit Rules published with this Ministry's Notification No. 60/46/48-III-Political, dated the 4th October 1948 :—

In the said Rules the existing rule 12 shall be renumbered as sub-rule (2) and the following new sub-rule shall be inserted as sub-rule (1), namely :—

"12. (1) The Central Government may by general or special order and, subject to such conditions as it may deem fit to impose, exempt any person or class of persons from the requirements of the Pakistan (Control of Entry) Ordinance".

PAKISTAN (DEALINGS IN IMMOVABLE EVACUEE PROPERTY) ORDINANCE, 1949

No. F. 28 (33)/49-P, 22nd November 1948.—In exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (4) of section 1 of the Pakistan (Dealings in Immovable Evacuee Property) Ordinance, 1949 (XI of 1949), the Central Government, in continuation of this Ministry's Notification No. F. 11 (37)/49-P., dated the 24th September 1949, is pleased to direct that the said Ordinance shall remain in force in West Punjab, the North-West Frontier Province, Sind, Baluchistan, the Capital of the Federation and the Acceding States for a further period of fifteen days beginning from the twenty-sixth day of November 1949.

CENTRAL EXCISE RULES, 1944,

(Exemption from Duty in respect of "Khallar Salt")

No. 3, 2nd December 1949.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-rule (1), of rule 8 of the Central Excise Rules, 1944, the Central Government is pleased to exempt, with effect from 1st December 1949, "Khallar Salt" issued under and in accordance with Industrial (Denatured) Salt Rules, 1939, from the duty leviable under the Central Excise and Salt Act, 1944 (I of 1944).
